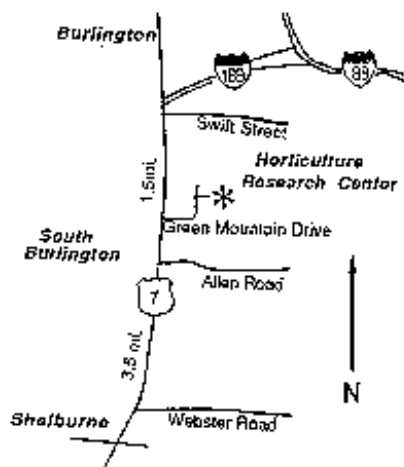

Directions from Interstate 89 to UVM Hort. Res. Center (Hort Farm):

Take Exit 13 to Interstate I-189. Turn left on Shelburne Road (U.S. Route 7) and follow Directions from Burlington below:

Directions from Burlington and the north:

Travel 1.5 miles south from the intersection of Interstate I-189 and Shelburne Road (U.S. Route 7). Turn left at the traffic light onto Green Mountain Drive after the state highway sign indicating the UVM HORT. FARM. Travel .3 miles on Green Mountain Drive and turn right onto the Horticultural Research Center access road.

Directions from Shelburne and the south:

Travel 3.5 miles north from the intersection in the center of Shelburne Village on U.S. Route 7. Turn right at the traffic light onto Green Mountain Drive after the state highway sign indicating the UVM HORT. FARM. Travel .3 miles on Green Mountain Drive and turn right onto the Horticultural Research Center access road.
